То	amend the National Nutrition Monitoring and Related Research Act of 1990 to improve the dietary guidelines, and for other purposes.
1	Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
2	tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
3	SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
4	This Act may be cited as the "Dietary Guidelines Re-

5 form Act of 2025".

1	SEC. 2. ESTABLISHMENT OF DIETARY GUIDELINES.
2	(a) In General.—Section 301(a) of the National
3	Nutrition Monitoring and Related Research Act of 1990
4	(7 U.S.C. 5341(a)) is amended—
5	(1) in paragraph (1)—
6	(A) by striking the paragraph designation
7	and heading and all that follows through "five
8	years" in the first sentence and inserting the
9	following:
10	"(1) In general.—At least every 10 years,";
11	and
12	(B) by adding at the end the following:
13	"Rulemaking requirements under section 553 of
14	title 5, United States Code, shall apply to the
15	development of each report under this para-
16	graph.";
17	(2) by indenting paragraphs (2) and (3) appro-
18	priately;
19	(3) in paragraph (2), by striking "shall" and all
20	that follows through the period at the end and in-
21	serting the following: "shall—
22	"(A) be based on significant scientific
23	agreement that is determined by evidence-based
24	review (as defined in paragraph (9)(A));
25	"(B) be current at the time that the report
26	is prepared;

1	"(C) be derived from the questions gen-
2	erated under paragraph (5)(E);
3	"(D) address high-priority areas of concern
4	to advance health outcomes;
5	"(E) be designed to achieve nutritional
6	adequacy and promote health, as specified by
7	the Food and Nutrition Board of the National
8	Academies of Sciences, Engineering, and Medi-
9	cine, through the consumption of food, includ-
10	ing nutrients and bioactive food components oc-
11	curring naturally and in fortified foods;
12	"(F) include nutritional and dietary infor-
13	mation relevant to individuals with common nu-
14	trition-related chronic diseases, as defined by
15	the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention;
16	and
17	"(G) include recommendations that are af-
18	fordable, available, and accessible for the gen-
19	eral population.";
20	(4) by redesignating paragraph (3) as para-
21	graph (8);
22	(5) by inserting after paragraph (2) the fol-
23	lowing:
24	"(3) Frequency.—The Secretaries may pub-
25	lish the report required under paragraph (1) more

1	frequently than required under that paragraph if the
2	Secretaries determine that more frequent publication
3	is necessary to promote health based on updated die-
4	tary reference intake values specified by—
5	"(A) the Food and Nutrition Board of the
6	National Academies of Sciences, Engineering,
7	and Medicine; and
8	"(B) other relevant scientific advancements
9	based on continuous review of the totality of
10	publicly available scientific evidence.
11	"(4) Notification of update.—
12	"(A) In General.—Not later than 90
13	days before the Secretaries plan to update a re-
14	port under paragraph (1), the Secretaries shall
15	submit notification of that plan, in writing, to
16	the Committees on Agriculture, Nutrition, and
17	Forestry and Health, Education, Labor, and
18	Pensions of the Senate and the Committees on
19	Agriculture and Energy and Commerce of the
20	House of Representatives.
21	"(B) Justification.—The notification
22	under subparagraph (A) shall include a jus-
23	tification for updating the report.
24	"(5) Independent advisory board.—

1	"(A) In General.—Not later than 90
2	days after the Secretaries submit a notification
3	under paragraph (4)(A), the Secretaries shall
4	establish an Independent Advisory Board (re-
5	ferred to in this paragraph as the 'Board').
6	"(B) Members.—The Board shall com-
7	prise not more than 8 members, of which—
8	"(i) 4 shall be appointed by the Secre-
9	taries, 2 of whom shall not be Federal em-
10	ployees; and
11	"(ii) 1 shall be appointed by each of
12	the highest-ranking Member on each Com-
13	mittee described in paragraph (4)(A) of
14	the opposite political party of the President
15	of the United States.
16	"(C) Expertise.—Each member ap-
17	pointed to the Board shall have expertise in nu-
18	trition science or food science, including aca-
19	demic and applied experience.
20	"(D) Meetings.—
21	"(i) In general.—The first meeting
22	of the Board shall take place on or after
23	the date that is 90 days after the Secre-
24	taries submit a notification under para-
25	graph $(4)(A)$.

1	"(ii) QUORUM.—A % majority of the
2	members shall constitute a quorum for the
3	transaction of the business of the Board.
4	"(E) Duties.—Not later than 1 year after
5	the establishment of the Board, the Board shall
6	submit to the Secretaries and the Committees
7	described in paragraph (4)(A) a list of scientific
8	questions based on the proposed report under
9	paragraph (1), which questions shall be used to
10	inform the work of the Secretaries on that re-
11	port and any relevant work of the Committees
12	described in paragraph (4)(A).
13	"(F) TERMINATION.—The authority of the
14	Board shall terminate, and the Board shall dis-
15	band, immediately after carrying out subpara-
16	graph (E).
17	"(6) Dietary reference intake updates.—
18	"(A) IN GENERAL.—The Secretaries shall
19	coordinate with the Joint United States-Canada
20	Dietary Reference Intake Working Group to en-
21	sure that the Food and Nutrition Board of the
22	National Academies of Sciences, Engineering,
23	and Medicine update the dietary reference in-
24	take values to represent the most up-to-date
25	understanding of nutritional science.

1	"(B) UPDATES.—The Joint United States-
2	Canada Dietary Reference Intake Working
3	Group is encouraged—
4	"(i) to initiate at least 1 dietary ref-
5	erence intake update per year; and
6	"(ii) to identify updates that are of
7	highest priority and necessitate review.
8	"(7) Exclusion.—The information and guide-
9	lines contained in each report required under para-
10	graph (1) shall not be based on or include topics
11	that are not relevant to dietary guidance, as deter-
12	mined by the Secretaries, in consultation with the
13	Independent Advisory Board established under para-
14	graph (5), including taxation, social welfare policies,
15	purchases under Federal feeding programs, food and
16	agricultural production practices, food labeling, so-
17	cioeconomic status, race, religion, ethnicity, culture,
18	or regulations relating to nutrition."; and
19	(6) by adding at the end the following:
20	"(9) Evidence-based review.—
21	"(A) Definition of Evidence-based
22	REVIEW.—In this paragraph, the term 'evi-
23	dence-based review' means a process under
24	which—

1	"(i) the totality of the scientific evi-
2	dence relevant to a question of interest is
3	collected, analyzed, and evaluated;
4	"(ii) scientific studies, conclusions,
5	and recommendations are rated, adhering
6	strictly to standardized, generally accepted
7	evidence-based review methods; and
8	"(iii) external peer review is con-
9	ducted by nongovernment experts with rec-
10	ognized expertise in quality-of-evidence
11	evaluation.
12	"(B) STRENGTH OF EVIDENCE.—Each
13	guideline contained in a report published under
14	paragraph (1) shall be assigned a rating by the
15	Secretaries for the strength of evidence used,
16	including the extent to which the guideline will
17	improve the Healthy Eating Index.
18	"(10) Transparency.—
19	"(A) DISCLOSURE.—Any individual ap-
20	pointed to the Dietary Guidelines Advisory
21	Committee or an Independent Advisory Board
22	established under paragraph (5) shall provide
23	full disclosure of all financial and nonfinancial
24	conflicts of interest relevant to their member-

1	ship using the Office of Government Ethics
2	Form 450 (or successor form).
3	"(B) Publication.—Notwithstanding any
4	other provision of law, not later than 30 days
5	after the date on which a Dietary Guidelines
6	Advisory Committee is established, the Secre-
7	taries shall make publicly available—
8	"(i) the disclosures required under
9	subparagraph (A), categorized by the name
10	of the individual; and
11	"(ii) a detailed plan for managing any
12	disclosed conflicts of interest, including fi-
13	nancial or ethical conflicts of interest, pref-
14	erences, values, and beliefs.
15	"(11) Funding.—Of the funds made available
16	by section 32 of the Act of August 24, 1935 (7
17	U.S.C. 612c), the Secretary of Agriculture shall
18	make available to carry out this subsection
19	\$5,000,000 for each of fiscal years 2025 through
20	2029, to remain available until expended.".
21	(b) Controlling Report.—The 2020 Dietary
22	Guidelines for Americans published by the Secretaries
23	under section 301(a)(1) of the National Nutrition Moni-
24	toring and Related Research Act of 1990 (7 U.S.C.
25	5341(a)(1)) (as in effect before the date of enactment of

- 1 this Act) shall be considered the most recent Dietary
- 2 Guidelines for Americans until the publication of the first
- 3 report under that section (as amended by subsection (a)).
