A BILL

To prohibit Federal agencies from providing on Federal forms, surveys, and documents, an option other than Male or Female to reference the sex of an individual, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Male or Female Only
5 Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. NO OPTION OTHER THAN MALE OR FEMALE TO**
2 **REFERENCE THE SEX OF AN INDIVIDUAL.**

3 (a) PROHIBITION.—With respect to any collection of
4 information conducted by the head of any agency through
5 a form, survey, or other document, the head of such agen-
6 cy—

7 (1) may not—

8 (A) solicit or obtain any information re-
9 garding the gender or gender identity of an in-
10 dividual; and

11 (B) with respect to any such collection in-
12 formation regarding the sex of an individual,
13 provide an option to select or mark on the form,
14 survey, or document that sex of an individual is
15 something other than male or female; and

16 (2) shall reject—

17 (A) any response provided by the person
18 from whom the information is being collected
19 stating the gender or gender identity of an indi-
20 vidual; and

21 (B) any response provided by the person
22 from whom the information is being collected
23 stating that the sex of an individual is some-
24 thing other than male or female.

25 (b) UPDATE.—Not later than 60 days after the date
26 of the enactment of this Act, the head of an agency of

1 the Federal Government shall update the forms, surveys,
2 and documents of the agency as necessary to ensure such
3 forms, surveys, and documents comply with the prohibi-
4 tion under subsection (a).
